I have a text file with X coordinate of each polyline and a text file with Y coordinate of each polyline, a CSV file with 3D points. Here is the expected output: A: For the desired output you have provided. I don't think it is possible with tools within QGIS (they are only for simple point to point conversion). You would need to use pylon and the openv2 module. Your example input has 1284 polylines. I did this in QGIS using the line count tool on the attribute table. The python script will create a polyline feature for each line. The last polyline feature in the output will have the line features as the input feature type and can be exported as a shapefile.

Groundbreaking research to be presented at the World Congress on Alcohol and Mental Health. Researchers from The University of Nottingham and the Brain, Mind and Behavior Institute of the University of Oregon are part of a new team of investigators based in Stockholm who have put together groundbreaking evidence showing a link between low income and psychological distress in the population of people living in Sweden. The research demonstrates that the connection is real, particularly among the most vulnerable, and that it is there in nearly all European countries that make up the EU. Dr Isabel Moreno, from The University of Nottingham's School of Psychology, said: "The relationship between income and psychological distress is not just an American problem. "There are links between low income and mental health problems in Europe as well, and that includes Sweden. "In the UK, we have the biggest challenge of all the countries in the EU, but that's not the only European country." The research, led by Dr Mark Crane, examined the connection between income and mental health in 17 European countries, comparing psychological distress among the population in relation to their place in the income hierarchy. In every country, the researchers found, low income people experienced more psychological distress than those in the higher income groups. The data showed that mental health was lower in people in the lowest income group in all of the countries where it was possible to compare the results. In only three countries, the researchers found the opposite; in Ireland, Greece and Slovakia, the poorest 82157476af
